

Mathura- Dwarkadheesh Temple

Mathura is largely regarded as the origin of a most compassionate lord of the Hindu Pantheon. Located neighboring to the holy river Yamuna, Dwarkadheesh Temple possess of exceptional architectural style of its own. This holy abode of Lord Krishna was built by Seth Gokul Das Parikh in the year 1814. One of the extremely respected shrines in Mathura, this temple is marvelously placed in the heart of the city. Spectacular structural design and awe-inspiring paintings coupled with outstanding carvings makes this sacred shrine incomparable. Along with the icon of Lord Krishna, the temple depicts the images of his beloved consort Radha and several other gods. Major crowd puller of the near surrounding area, this temple turns to be an ocean of devotees during the festive time of Holi and Janmashtami. Darshan timings of the temple are between 7 am to 8 pm on all days around the year.
